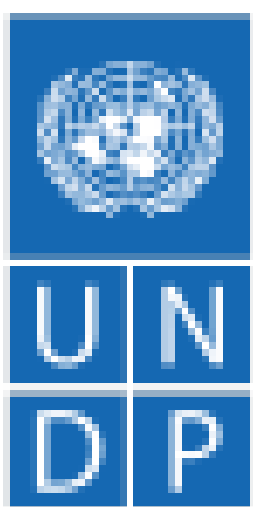

### Training description

Digital transformation is a critical enabler for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly in Small Island Developing States (SIDS), where unique challenges and opportunities exist. This course empowers civil servants, policymakers, and stakeholders to design and implement inclusive, whole-of-government, and whole-of-society approaches to digital transformation that foster sustainable development and resilience at a national and sectoral level.

Participants will explore the five pillars of digital transformation—government, infrastructure,

regulation, business, and people—while analyzing real-world examples, challenges, and opportunities. The course features tools such as the UNDP Digital Readiness Assessment as well as insights from global case studies and extensive knowledge resources from organizations like the UNDP, ITU, World Bank, and GSMA. Guest sessions will cover emerging trends in artificial intelligence (AI) and digital public infrastructure (DPI), highlighting their transformative potential for SIDS. This course will also reference international best practices and approaches to designing national or sectoral digital transformation strategies. Participants will explore their applicability in weekly live sessions and gain insights from expert mentors throughout the course. At the end of the course, participants will have completed a draft sectoral digital transformation plan
