4. GENERAL INFORMATION

Weather

The temperature in Brasília varies during daytime from 20°C to 30°C and in the evening time from 18°C to 20°C. The meeting will occur during the rainy season, so it's recommended to be prepared

Time Zone

The standard time of Brasília is -2 hours in relation to UTC due to the summer time.

Currency and Banks

Payments are made in local currency only. For reference, the current rate is approximately US\$ 1.00 = R\$ 4.00. Please note that exchange rates can float in Brazil and, in addition to the exchange rate, is charge a tax of 1,1% on the exchange transaction.



Banks are open from 11:00am to 4:00pm on weekdays. Foreign currency and traveler's checks can be exchanged into "Reais" in some specific banks in Brasilia (Banco do Brasil, Banco Central, Banco de Boston and Citibank). It is recommended that exchange be made at the counters or bank agencies of Banco do Brasil located in the international airports of Rio de Janeiro, Sao Paulo and Brasília.

Credit cards (VISA, MasterCard, American Express and Diners Club) are generally accepted at hotels, department stores and restaurants.

Tipping

Tipping is a common practice in bars and restaurants. A normal tip is 10% of the price on the bill. Usually the tip is already included in the bill.

Electricity System

Electricity in Brazil is 110/220 Volts. In Brasilia, the standard voltage is 220 Volts. The three-pin plug is adopted as standard, but several formats can still be found. It's recommended to bring a universal adapter.



Transportation

From the Juscelino Kubitschek International Airport to the proposed hotels: Around 20 minutes by taxi (BRL 50,00).

Note: The Society of Collective Transport of Brasilia (TCB) operates the Executive Kubitschek International Airport Bus, Line 113.



The service is available daily from 6:30am to 11:55pm with the following circular itinerary:

Airport (departure in arrivals floor – right side of the external area), the Ministries, Hotels Sectors North, Ulysses Guimarães Convention Center, Hotels Sectors South, Airport.

Touristic Information

Brasília, the capital of Brazil, is in the Federal District, west central Brazil. It is situated in a savannah at an elevation of about 1,100 m (about 3,300 ft.) and has a mild and dry climate.

Brasilia is a city of striking modern appearance and was constructed (beginning in 1957) on an uninhabited site to replace crowded Rio de Janeiro as the national capital.

The city layout, which was designed by the Brazilian urban planner Lúcio Costa, resembles a jetliner in shape. Along the "fuselage", which is the city's main axis, are the offices of the national government, the Cathedral, the National Library, the National Theater and the Republic Museum; the "wings", north and south, contain blocks of residential apartment buildings and foreign embassies. At the nose of the "fuselage" is the Plaza of the Three Powers, in which is set the Palácio do Planalto (Planalto's Palace), the National Congress and the Supreme Court. The whole area, from the Cathedral to Palácio do Planalto, is named Esplanada dos Ministérios (Minister's Esplanade).

All the main buildings in Brasilia were designed by the famous Brazilian architect Oscar Niemeyer.

Near the venue of the event, there is the TV Tower, one of the most famous touristic points of the city. It has an illuminated fountain that works almost every day of the week at night. Brasil 21 Complex is also next to City Park, one of the biggest urban parks of the world and the biggest one of the South America. There are bicycle stations around the city that can be rented per hour. More information can be found in:
