1. INTRODUCTION

There is general consensus that IoT has enormous potential to deliver great impact on the economy and on society at large. Having a good grasp of the relevant technical aspects is a must for bringing this to fruition. This capacity building course aims to provide the audience with a better technical understanding of wireless solutions for IoT. Participants will be exposed to the general aspects of IoT networks and will then dive into specifics of LPWAN and cellular solutions tailored to IoT like LTE-M and NB-IoT.

Practical examples of IoT wireless technologies will be demonstrated.

5. VISA FORMALITIES

Most non-EU (European Union) visitors coming to ICTP will need a visa to enter Italy and either a declaration or a permit of stay to formalize their visit in the country. Important information is available at the following URL:

EU and/or Schengen passport and/or identity card holders do not need a visa to enter Italy, according to instructions received from the Italian authorities.

6. ACCOMMODATION

ICTP visitors have a wide selection of accommodations at their disposal, from a room in one of our on-campus guesthouses to rooms in local hotels. The best accommodation for short-term visitors to ICTP are the Galileo and the Adriatico guesthouses. Accompanying family members can be accommodated in the guesthouses subject to availability. All charges should be settled directly with the guesthouse. Guesthouses accept payments either in cash (Euro), by Pos or by Credit Card (Cartasi, Mastercard, American Express, Visa, BankAmericard).

8. DETAILS OF ARRIVAL AND TRANSPORT

Trieste, home to ICTP, is located in the northeast corner of Italy, close to the Slovenian border. It is easily reachable by plane, train and automobile. Arriving by plane, one can choose to land at Trieste Airport, Venice Marco Polo Airport, or Treviso Airport. More information on getting from the airport to ICTP is available at the URL:

Trains operated by Trenitalia travel frequently between Trieste and major Italian cities. Buses are available for local and regional transport.

9. CURRENCY

The Euro is the official currency in Italy. In Italy, cash payments are the norm. However, large shops, restaurants and travel agencies accept major credit cards. Note that cashing cheques issued by foreign banks can present considerable difficulty. Italian banking law prescribes that such cheques can be deposited only into a bank account, and a charge is normally levied upon this transaction. An ATM machine is available at ICTP's Enrico Fermi building.

10. ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES

- A. The voltage in Italy is 220 volts.
- B. For electric power, there are sockets of German ("Schuko") and Italian ("bipasso") type, also compatible with Europlugs.

11. LANGUAGES

English is the working language at ICTP. Italian language are spoken in Trieste.

12. SECURITY

The security situation in Italy remains in line with other European Countries. In Trieste, public transportation is considered safe and efficient and the maintenance and condition of the road network is good.

13. MEDICAL AND HEALTH

Italian Law requires all foreigners to have valid health insurance coverage while in Italy. Failure to comply will result in a denial of permission of stay on Italian territory. Visitors who have official documents certifying their participation in a national health insurance scheme, valid in Italy, do not have to obtain separate coverage.

Citizens of EU-EEA, Switzerland, including other nationals having legal residence and who are enrolled in the social security system in these countries, should bring their European Health Insurance Card with them. This must be shown in case medical assistance or hospitalization in Italy is required.

Non-EU (European Union) visitors should verify if their home country's national health insurance programme is recognized in Italy and bring a statement in English by the local insurance company.

14. WEATHER

Trieste is located in northeastern Italy, on the Adriatic sea. Although it seldom snows, the local climate ranges from cold (as low as -2C and less in December-February) and windy (due to a cold wind from the NE called the bora), to hot (as high as +30C in July-August). In all seasons, it is advisable to have an umbrella, waterproof shoes and sweater. In winter, a coat, gloves, hat and scarf are necessary.
